Nestled among the Appalachian Mountains in Pennsylvania's exact geographic center is the town of State College, nicknamed "Happy Valley." Encompassing Penn State University, it is home to roughly 50,000 students from over 100 different countries and a comparable number of permanent residents. But a name like Happy Valley can be misleading. PSU students face numerous challenges as they navigate a fragmented secular environment brimming with post-Christian assumptions about the world. Among American Christian high school graduates, roughly 70% will walk away from their faith in college.

Across university campuses, rates of anxiety and mental illness are higher than ever—and continuing to rise. I see the fruits firsthand. For Generation Z (*born 1997-2010*), social media and internet overuse have generated an epidemic of loneliness. College-aged adults are not forming relationships as readily as they used to, much less a relationship with God. Without a strong community of faith, students feel spiritually aimless. In this age of TikTok celebrities and social media influencers, there is constant pressure to create an original identity for oneself. Life becomes a desperate grasping after recognition and acceptance. Love feels fragile and elusive. Party life and pleasure-seeking offer temporary numbness but yield no satisfying answers. At PSU, with only a small percentage of students actively following Jesus, our task is urgent.

In July 2023, I became pastor of Incarnation Church, an Anglican church plant meeting on campus at Penn State. Incarnation exists for one purpose: to make disciples of Jesus Christ. As a university church, our setting is of great strategic importance in the Kingdom of God. We are reaching the next generation at the precise time when they are wrestling with questions of faith.

Incarnation is a young, dynamic community. Though most of our parishioners are students in their twenties and thirties, God has blessed us with a growing number of faculty, local residents, and children. We are also a global community with parishioners from Nigeria, Zimbabwe, Iran, Brazil, India, and all over the United States. By God's miraculous grace, PSU gives us access to the beautiful Eisenhower Chapel for our services and an office at their Spiritual Center—all completely rent-free!

Through Bible studies, one-on-one discipleship, hospitality, and peer evangelism—student ministry is the heart and soul of our church. But, we also maintain a small children's ministry and a satellite congregation at Wynwood House, a local nursing home, where the students and I conduct weekly services for homebound seniors. We are pioneering a new ministry to faculty, promoting the integration of faith and scholarship. And in the next season, we hope to expand our ministry by hiring a full-time campus missionary in partnership with the Coalition for Christian Outreach.

The Lord has richly blessed us! Last spring, our community celebrated the conversions and baptisms of two graduate students—one from a Hindu background and another from a Jewish background. This season, we will have four confirmations, two infants baptized, and two adults beginning baptismal preparation. Other examples of grace abound: One student is beginning to explore overseas missions while another is sharing her faith boldly among her classmates. A victim of spiritual abuse is starting to pray again—for the first time in years. A girl who identifies as ‘queer’ and agnostic is considering Christianity afresh. This is only the beginning...

We are an unconventional church plant—but first and foremost, we are missionaries. As a congregation of young students with little income, we rely on the generosity of our friends and supporters.
