

# ALLELUIA! CHRIST IS RISEN!

*This article is from Easter Sunday.*

WELCOME TO ST. PETER'S! Whether this is your first worship service here, or you've lost count, we're so glad you're here to celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead.

This celebration is the highest point of the Church year because Jesus' resurrection is the foundation on which the Christian faith is built. Unlike other faiths, Christianity centers on an objective, historical event—that Christ was:

*"Delivered up for our trespasses, and was raised for our justification." (ROMANS 4:25)*

St. Paul puts it this way in his First Letter to the Corinthians:

*"If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain...and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins."*

THE GOOD NEWS we celebrate today, is that Christ indeed has been raised from the dead! Jesus' resurrection not only validated His claim to be God Incarnate and the Messiah of Israel, but it is also a sure and certain sign that Jesus has defeated all of the spiritual forces of evil that stand against us: sin, the devil, and even death itself. We hope you experience the goodness of God, and the joy of Jesus' resurrection as you worship here in this Cathedral Church today!

We are an Anglican Church and the Cathedral of the Gulf Atlantic Diocese of the Anglican Church in North America. As such, we are rooted in the theology and worship of the English Reformation and our service consists of a regular pattern of prayers, music/songs, and readings that fall into two movements. In the **LITURGY OF THE WORD**, we listen to God's word read, sung, prayed, and taught. In the **LITURGY OF THE TABLE**, we are nourished by God through the sacrament of his body and blood. The liturgy, which follows the *ACNA Book of Common Prayer 2019*, is all in the accompanying Service Bulletin for you to easily follow along & participate. Old & New Testament passages are taken from *The Holy Bible, English Standard Version*; Psalms are taken from the *New Coverdale Psalter*.

There are resources at the desks in the Narthex (*the front entrance*) to help you get better acquainted with us. Please also introduce yourself to the wonderful folks stationed at the desks.

Finally, we invite you to return to our Cathedral for worship on Sundays, but of equal importance, to become part of this family of broken people—brothers and sisters saved not by works, but by grace, through the death, resurrection, and ascension of our Savior, Jesus Christ!

The Arch and I just recently returned from our tour of Egypt, and I want to give you all a report on one of the most amazing journeys of our lives. This trip has been on my bucket list for almost my entire life—at least since I read Agatha Christie's 'Death on the Nile' in my teenage years.

We had absolutely no issues with security the entire time in Egypt. For many years, the government has decreed that all tour coaches are accompanied by a security person on the coach, who kept a very low profile and whisked us through the occasional roadblocks/security checks.

From our first visit to the amazing Temple at Karnack to the Pyramids and the Sphinx at Giza, to the Valley of the Kings, the spectacular new Grand Egyptian Museum, and the Egyptian Museum in Cairo, no day was without its awe-inspiring site visits. We also had a couple of great visits to Coptic Cairo, where we visited sites where the Holy Family traveled, and All Saints Anglican Cathedral with its multinational congregation. I really can't recommend this tour enough—it is truly a once-in-a-lifetime experience. The hotels were fabulous, the ship and its crew couldn't have been more wonderful, and Egypt has to be seen to be believed.
